Confirmation Program 2023

- Sunday Mass Attendance. Just like our bodies, our souls also need to be fed and nourished. Sunday Mass is
 the primary way that God nourishes us with the Scriptures and the Eucharist. Also, worshiping God together as a
 parish family gives us new strength and joy. Those preparing for Confirmation need to keep Sunday as a day of
 rest and prayer. We also need to be consistent. Those not regularly attending Mass make themselves ineligible
 for Confirmation.
- Application for Confirmation and the Sponsor Form. (DUE August 31st) These forms need to be completed and returned to the parish office. Additional copies of these forms are available on the parish website. They are important for adding the necessary annotations to your child's baptism certificate. Please fill them out completely. Remember, the sponsor must be an actively practicing Catholic who has received Confirmation. Consult the sponsor form very carefully before choosing a sponsor. The specific requirements for sponsors are set by Canon Law and we cannot make exceptions. Sponsors are guides; they cannot lead our young Catholics if they are not themselves walking the path.
- Service Program. (DUE 2 weeks before the Confirmation date) Rather than requiring a set number of hours,
 we will focus especially on the spiritual works of service that we can do for people in our community. Please see
 the Service Program sheet for information and requirements for the project and reflection paper.
- Confirmation Retreat. Our retreat will take place on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>Oct</u>, <u>24th</u>. Attendance is required and takes
 precedence over sports and other activities, which makes for a good teaching moment to help our students order
 their priorities and their lives in a healthy way. More details will be shared as the retreat date approaches.
- Catechetical Program. Classes will be on Wednesdays at 4pm beginning on August 23. Because this
 course is abbreviated in length, full attendance is required. (TCA students receive this instruction in regular
 class.)
 - The program includes writing a Saint report, DUE September 30th.
- Confirmation Day. The students should ride to the Cathedral in Peoria with their families, arriving 45 minutes early (by 3:15pm). There will be a group photo with the Bishop. After the ceremony, our newly confirmed will be available for more photos and then released to celebrate with their families and will return home with them.

- Asistencia a Misa dominical. Al igual que nues ros cuerpos, nuestras almas también necesitan ser alimentadas y nutridas. La Misa dominical es la forma principa, en que Dios nos nutre con las Escrituras y la Eucaristía. Además, adorar a Dios juntos como familia parroquial nos da nuevas fuerzas y alegría. Los que se preparan para la Confirmación deben guardar el domingo como un día de descanso y oración. También tenemos que ser constantes. Aquellos que no asisten a Misa regularmente no son elegibles para la Confirmación.
- Solicitud de Confirmación y Formulario del padrino. (VENCIMIENTO 31 de agosto) Estos formularios deben completarse y devolverse a la oficina parroquial. Copias adicionales de estos formularios están disponibles en el sitio web de la parroquia. Son importantes para agregar las anotaciones necesarias al certificado de bautismo de su hijo. Candidates for Confirmation fittingly seek the spiritual help of a sponsor. Sponsors "must be firm believers, able and ready to help the confirmed on the road of Christian life. Their task is a truly ecclesial function....bearing some responsibility for the development and safeguarding of the grace given at Baptism." (CCC 1255) Like parents and godparents, the sponsor shares in the responsibility for the salvation of the young soul entrusted to them.

The sponsor should be a Catholic who loves and lives his or her faith and is committed to continue to grow in the knowledge and love of Christ and His Church. A sponsor encourages the candidate for Confirmation by word and example to contemplate the divine mysteries in daily prayer, receive frequently the sacraments of Holy Communion and Sacramental Confession, and live a life of virtue and integrity. A sponsor's heart reflects the tender and affectionate love of the hearts of Jesus and Mary and the gifts of the Holy Spirit, providing a living model of a joyful Christian life.

they wish to invoke as a special heavenly patron and as a role model to imitate on earth. The process of choosing a confirmation name requires prayer and reflection and perhaps even some research. Each candidate should know about the life, spirituality, and particular virtues of their chosen patron. If the candidate's baptismal name is that of a recognized saint, he or she may also choose to reclaim that name for use at confirmation.

LaSalle Catholic Confirmation Service Project

Service Rationale

"What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if you say you have faith but do not have works? Can faith save you? If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, 'Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill,' and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead. But someone will say, 'You have faith and I have works.' Show me your faith apart from your works, and I by my works will show you my faith." St. James 2:14-18

Service to others and the community is an essential part of the Christian's life. The service project's aim is to encourage our young Confirmandi to explore first-hand the different ways they are able to help others in the name of Christ. The project should not be seen as gaining hours as points toward a goal, but rather as an internship wherein a variety of service opportunities are explored as a beginning to a lifestyle of Christian service.

The service project this year is focused more heavily on the spiritual works of mercy. These kind spiritual actions can truly be more beneficial than physical assistance. Please review the following points toward the completion of your written service project.

Service Requirements

- Five unique activities and a well-written reflection paper must be completed before the end of September.
- 2. The projects must be discussed and witnessed by a parent or guardian.
- 3. Choose a variety of activities, you may certainly do more than five.
- Service must be offered freely and joyfully even when we don't initially feel excited about the activity. (The maturity to set aside our own inclinations in service to others is a prerequisite for the service program.)

Reflection Paper

Students are asked to prepare a 3-4 page paper (1" margins, Times New Roman, double spaced, size 12 font) reflecting on their experiences. The reflection paper might consider these questions:

- What did I do? When did I do it? For whom? Why did I choose this work?
- How did I feel doing the work or activity? What impact did it have on me?
- How did my project benefit others?
- How did I experience God in the work?
- Which of the Corporal or Spiritual Works of Mercy were involved in my service?
- How did my service connect to what Jesus asks of us in Matthew 25:31-46?
- How does charitable prayer and work relate to being a Confirmed Catholic?

Confirmation Service Options

In place of service hours, Confirmation candidates should complete at least five of the following. Enter into the work, not as a task to complete, but as an experience to explore and a service to offer. If completed with an open heart, writing the reflection paper will be quick and easy!

- Visit a cemetery, and read the names on 25 tombstones, pausing and praying a Hail Mary for the repose of each person's soul, remembering also that we will one day be called from this world.
- Write a letter (an actual pen and paper letter...people like to receive those!) to a family member or friend (perhaps someone who lives far away), tell them how you're doing, being sure to mention that you are preparing for Confirmation and asking them to pray for you.
- Come to one of the three Marian grottos outside the LaSalle Churches, spend 5 minutes in silence asking Mary to pray for something or someone specific for you, offer a decade of the Rosary, then take a photo and share it on your (or your parents') social media account.
- Make a phone call (or even better, video chat) to one of your godparents, and ask them
 what they remember from your Baptism day. Try to find out the date of your baptism and
 the details of that day you were first made a child of God.
- 5. Make a list of at least 3 blessings that you've received during the past school year, thank God for the blessings, and then share them with your family.
- Pray a rosary with your Confirmation sponsor (usually takes about 17 minutes). It can be done over the phone or via video chat if need be.
- 7. Make cards or write letters to residents in the Veterans' Home or local nursing homes.
- Record yourself reading a book for the students at Lighted Way and send it to Mrs. Baker to be shared on the PALS portion of their website.
- Research about Eucharistic Adoration on the internet. Write what you learned about Jesus' presence with us in the Sacred Host.
- 10. Stop by Holy Rosary during Adoration for at least a quarter-hour of prayer before the Lord. Describe the experience of being in his actual presence.
- 11. Prepare a large paper grocery bag of nonperishable food for the parish food pantry. Think about the items that people would really appreciate (not just a bunch of canned goods). Pray for the family that will receive your bag and bring it to the parish office.
- 12. Interview someone that you know is a good example of a faithful Catholic Christian. Ask them, when they became Catholic, why they are Catholic, and how their faith influences their life.
- 13. Help maintain the parish grounds and gardens. Meditate on the beauty of life and the creative genius of God. Contact Sr. Norberta at srnoberta@lasallecatholic.org to get started.
- 14. Care for the lawns or rake leaves for elderly or sick neighbors free of charge. Give thanks for your health and strength and grow in empathy for those who are physically impaired.
- 15. Create and deliver care packages to the homebound, missionaries, or military personnel. Reflect on what it would be like to be away from your home, family or the lifestyle you are accustomed to.

Saint Report Overview

Your saint report is a reflection on the significance of your chosen patron for the universal Church and for you personally. The decision of your Confirmation Saint is an important one. This report allows you to more formally and intentionally express the reason for seeking the spiritual friendship and patronage of your new name-sake.

Please spend time and thought in this composition. It should be well-written with good grammar and spelling. <u>It must be handwritten and 4-pages in length</u>. Be careful to use your own words and thoughts. An informal list of sources should be listed on a separate piece of paper. Plagiarized work will not be accepted (no copying!).

The report is due before the end of the Confirmation Class session. It constitutes a necessary and required part of the Class.

Please consider the following prompts as a guide to begin your reflection paper:

- What is your saint known for or famous for?
- Does your saint have a unique iconography? (That is how is he or she usually depicted, what symbols represent your saint in art and why are those symbols significant?)
- Are there any particular prayers of devotions to your saint?
- Why did you choose your saint?
- What virtues did your saint exercise that you wish to emulate?
